

## WHITE BEAR AVE CORRIDOR – STATIONS AND BUS LANE CONCEPTS

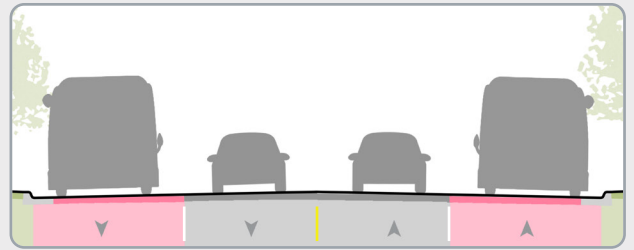
After several months of evaluation and engagement, the project is advancing 12 stations along Maryland, White Bear, and Beam avenues, shown below. Exact station placement will be determined as design advances. The station locations are near intersections where Route 54 currently stops along the Purple Line corridor.



The project is developing layout options of the Purple Line through the White Bear Ave Corridor. The options will display bus lanes, boarding locations, general traffic lanes, sidewalks, and more. See options of bus lanes and general traffic lanes being considered below.

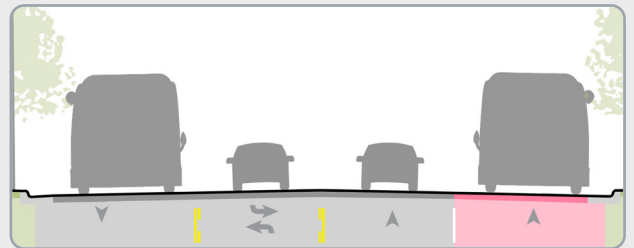
### SIDE-RUNNING BUS LANES

Bus lanes will allow right turns and property access. Stations are located on the sidewalk.



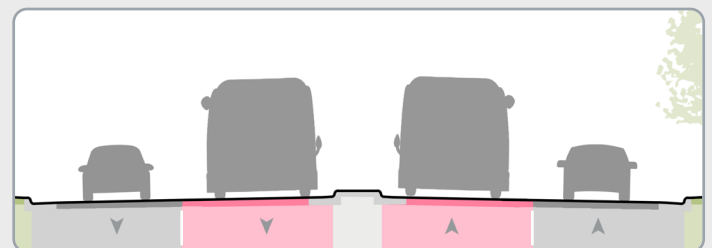
### ONE BUS LANE WITH 3-LANE ROAD

Bus lane in only one direction to allow more left-turn opportunities for property and roadway access.



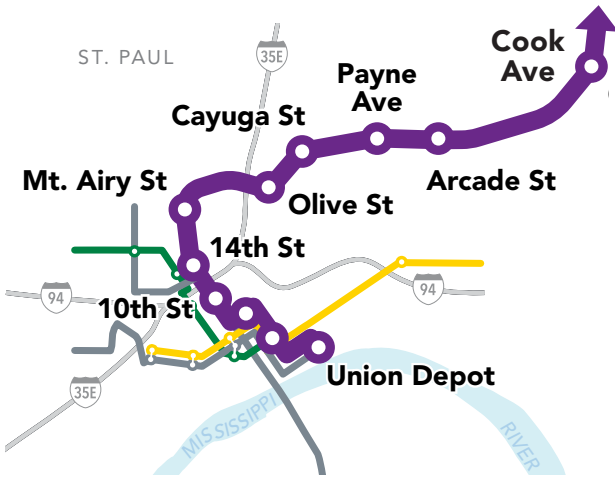
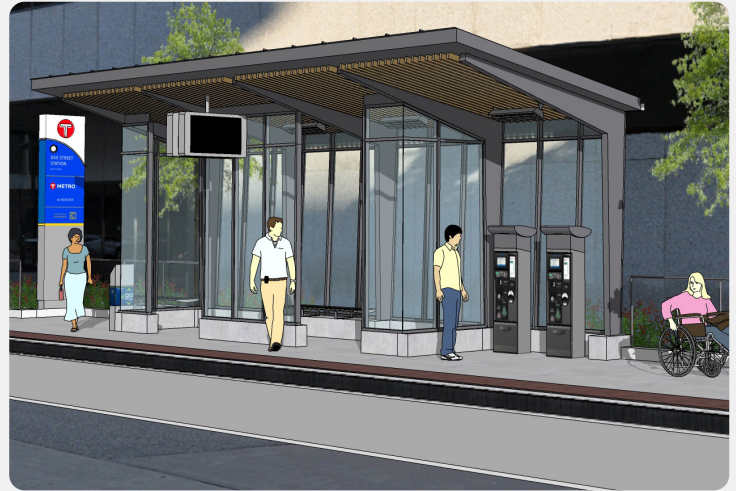
### CENTER-RUNNING BUS LANES

Bus lanes can only be used by transit and emergency vehicles. Stations are located near the center.



## BUS RAPID TRANSIT STATION AMENITIES

- Pylon station marker
- Shelter with heat, light, and seating
- Information kiosk
- Real-time arrival information
- Textured warning strip and raised curb
- Fare card readers
- Ticket machines
- Bike parking
- Bench seating
- Trash and recycling bins



## STATION AREA PLANNING

- Ramsey County is leading station area planning efforts for the defined corridor through St. Paul.
- Station Area Working Groups first met in September 2023, participants represented 10th Street through Cook Avenue stations.
- Working Groups will meet over the next several months to map location-specific assets and envision the future.
